Acts 6:1-7

Jesus' disciples were increasing in number. One group murmured against another that their widows were neglected in the daily distribution. The disciples met and said it was not right that they should give up the ministry of the word to wait tables.

The apostles prayed and laid hands on them and the word of God increased.

1 Peter 2:4-9

some of America's most needy home mission Catholic parishes. Participants must be free of any physical disabilities, in excellent physical condition, and fit to labor in the summer heat.
